CDC Report

CDC Tim Swiggum reported the DNR is wanting Marvin Matejka, owner of the OMI Building, to get started on the contamination clean-up. The United Communities of Clark County was hosted by Owen on 1/25/16 at the Woodland Hotel. Discussed at that meeting was the Clark County Communications System is being considered for replacement. It can be upgraded to an analog system for \$2 million which would last 5-10 years or it can all be replaced by a brand new digital system for \$4 million which would last 20-30 years. The UCC recommends to the County to do the digital system replacement.
